## **Academy Training**

All who are selected will be required to complete a 13 week, quasi-military training program at the Middlesex County Auxiliary Police Academy in Edison. Classes begin in March and are held every Tuesday, (a few Wednesday) and Thursday night as well as all day on select Saturday's.
